The Kickstarters Gascoyne Dash® is a genuine desert race. It is an awesome challenge across some of the harshest and remote country in Australia. Situated between the seaside town of Carnarvon and Gascoyne Junction WA—the desert by the sea.

The Dash is a motor sport event that pits car against car and bike against bike and then the quickest of each against each other to determine who will be crowned the “King of the River”. The name Kickstarters is in memory of local identity Neville Brandstater who tragically drowned in the Lyndon River in 1995.

Gascoyne refers to the mighty Gascoyne River. Dash refers to the first races which were boat events down the flooded Gascoyne River. Unfortunately the Gascoyne rarely flows so move over boats and come in cars and bikes.

DAWSON'S BURROWING BEES

Information

One of the world's largest bee species. The Burrowing Bee is also known as Mungurrurra (Pronounced: Moogadgurrah, in the Yinggarda language). These giant hairy bees are found on the claypans of the Gascoyne region in Western Australia. These bees are a delicacy to the Aboriginal people of the Gascoyne. The bees larvae are a source of sweet food for the Aboriginal people, many of whom speak with reverence about the Bee and with a fondness for the food it gives them.

After a month or two, they will dig them up, cook them in their mud capsule in an open fire, knock the tops off the capsule and eat them. Therefore, they don't produce honey as such. It has begun to make its annual appearance in and around Carnarvon. They are a solitary, ground-nesting species unique to WA's north-west (Mainly in the Gascoyne region) and can only be seen from July to September when their forage plants, the poverty bush and bluebells are in bloom. There is no Queen, and they do not live in colonies, but they form large aggregations, with thousands of bees making individual nest burrows. Females burrow into hard-baked clay pans to make their nests. Males roost overnight on the surrounding vegetation. During the day, large males brawl over access to females as they emerge from their burrows. Sometimes even the female becomes the casualty in the frenzied brawling. Females lay up to 7 eggs in individual cells within their nests. After the female has finished laying her eggs, she emerges from her burrow, seals the opening then dies. By this time, the male will have also died, leaving only the next generation developing underground. These bees, although big and noisy, are harmless. The Females will sting, but only if picked up (Good luck at trying to catch her). They readily tolerate us observing them and will reveal much of their daily life to anyone willing to spend an hour or two in their company.

Frequently Asked Questions

How many burrows can make up a nesting aggregation?

Up to 10,000 (maybe even more).

When are the bees active?

During the months of July and August in the Carnarvon region (or as late as September further south).

Is Dawson's Bee the largest species in Australia.

Not quite. Some of Australia's carpenter bees are even larger.

Is Dawson's Burrowing Bee found in other parts of Australia?

No, only in Western Australia where it inhabits the plains of the North-West extending south almost to Paynes Find.

SPECTATOR INFORMATION

Spectators are directed to view the Vehicles whilst standing within the markers indicating the limits of the controlled spectator area—spectating outside those areas indicated is prohibited.

Spectators must not stand in no go areas, and must at all times stand behind the bunting or barriers which mark the spectator area.

The instructions of the Spectator Marshals must be obeyed. The Chief Spectator Marshal has the power to inform the Clerk of the Course of potential spectator safety issues which may result in a section or the entire event being postponed until the spectator point is controlled to their satisfaction. Event organisers have used what are considered the most appropriate routes.

It is strongly recommended any spectator instructions are used to find your way around the event. There are risks such as meeting up with oncoming vehicles, and many roads in areas used by the event may have wash-aways, collapsed bridges etc which are potentially hazardous for the driver. The recommended spectator routes have been reviewed by event management.

CAMP RULES

No fires, firearms, pets
No aggro
No riding on back of utes
No unlicensed vehicles allowed (unless competing)
Only licenced bike riders to ride bikes
All riders MUST wear a helmet
No competition vehicles to be driven after 6pm or before 5.30am
Movement of all vehicles around camp area not to exceed 15kph
No spectators or children allowed in the pits
Noise to be kept to a minimum after midnight

Be responsible for your rubbish and place in the bags/bins provided
Competitors are responsible for the behaviour and actions of their crew and associates

Failure to abide by these rules or any other behaviour deemed offensive, aggressive, unsafe or against the spirit of the Kickstarters Gascoyne Dash® may result in you being asked to leave.

DO'S & DON'T'S OF SPECTATING

Be Aware - Vehicles under competition conditions can lose control and leave the defined track at any time. Do not stand in any areas which are not authorised or which are contrary to the advice of the organisers and officials/marshals or where you feel may be unsafe.

Be Prepared - bring hats, ground cover, sun screen and protection in case of rain or cold weather. Ensure you have some of your own food and drinks available.

Be Sensible - park your car sensibly so that it will not obstruct emergency vehicles, competitors, other spectators. In all cases obey parking instructions given by supervising officials. Do not try to emulate Off Road drivers. Drive carefully both to and from spectator viewing areas, and be ready to give way if necessary on narrow stretches of road. Please do not take young children to spectator points. If you have to, make sure they are completely under your control and that they do not get in the way of competing cars or mechanics or officials when they are working. Do not smoke near a car that is being serviced or refuelled.

Be Respectful - we rely on the land owners to allow us to compete on their land. Assist us in ensuring we are welcomed back for future events.
